This year we have dealt with one setback after another. As a result, our leaders, who have mostly come to know the Lord with us, have bound together more than ever. In fact, we have been asked lately to do two funerals, a revival, several family services in homes new to our ministry, and a New Year's service. We have four new places that want us to start Bible Studies in their homes for their families and neighbors. My role has been to help set up the studies, do the first lesson, work with the leader, and make the certificates when they successfully complete the study.

We are known around the river as a team from Palmas de Mamre, and are functioning as such. Our newest member of the team is a young man named Louis. Louis was part of my Sunday School class from 4 years old. He was invited by a small group of 6 Christians in a little country community about 1 ½ hours from us to be their pastor at 21 years old. He now has a regular attendance of 3 services a week of from 20 to 30 faithful adults plus their children.

Louis has asked me to work with him in some way to support his leadership and assist when needed, which we are now doing.. I was recently blessed to meet with him at a small café, and find believers from his group with a hymnal singing praises to our LORD.
