6.2 EARTHQUAKE JOLTS COSTA RICA

Strongest Earthquake in 150 Years Hits 20 Miles NW of San Jose 34 Dead, 91 Injured, More Missing Rock Slides, Broken Dams, Heavy Rains Hamper Rescue Efforts as Strong Aftershocks Continued

One week after our winter Missionary Training School began, a powerful earthquake rocked central Costa Rica. The effects of the dam breaks, flooding, and mudslides wreaked havoc on the Rio Sarapiqui. As the river became a mass of brown "jello" all aquatic life except for the crocodiles, suffocated. Our big boat Lucille sustained extensive damage to its motor, and another boat later capsized and sank. The river has cleared now, but the crocodiles are STILL hungry!! People are gradually starting to go in the river again but are very cautious.

He had a machete wound that was my first to stitch up with a needle from my sewing kit. The lack of anesthesia in those days didn't matter as he fainted and felt nothing. Juan has often accompanied us as we move along these rivers sharing the gospel. He made a commitment to Christ during this last school as he was journeying with us. He wants to be a mission preacher, and has agreed to head up the ministry at the Delta base.
